
And in the small valley towns and villages, all rich with history and tradition, there awaits you a warm, welcoming and cordial atmosphere in the **many hotels**

# A different ski slope every day



A ski slope 380 km long!

You can ski on the slopes of the most beautiful ski areas in western Trentino with a single Ski Pass: **150** aerial lifts and a total of **380** kilometers of slopes. That's the "SUPERSKIRAMA DOLOMITI Adamello Brenta" Ski Pass. This pass is valid from a day to 14 consecutive days on the slopes in the Val di Sole in Folgarida-Marilleva, Peio, Tonale with Ponte di Legno but also in the following areas which have joined these resorts: Madonna di Campiglio, Pinzolo, Andalo and Fai della Paganella, Monte Bondone, and Folgaria-Lavarone.

### Folgarida-Marilleva connected with Madonna di Campiglio

Folgarida and Marilleva feature 27 quick, modern ski lifts, and 32 slopes (including 47% easy, 40% medium, and 13% difficult) with a total of 53 kilometers of slopes! These two winter sport centers offer total ski enjoyment, with floodlight slopes for evening skiing – a true paradise for alpine skiers and snowboarders. Because of the lift connection with Madonna di Campiglio, this large-scale ski region features a total of 120 km of slopes with a breath-taking view of the maiestic Brenta Dolomites.

The Folgarida - Marilleva - Madonna di Campiglio ski area is reachable also from the heart of Val di Sole thanks to the new 8 seater cabin lift which departs from the adjacent train station in Daolasa – Commezzadura!

Thus the Folgarida and Marilleva ski resorts are perfectly linked with the Trento-Malé-Marilleva train system, creating a unique system of "tires, train wheels and lifts", which has helped to dramtically reduce the daily traffic up to the ski areas.

### Tonalepass Ski up to 3000 meters

Not only skiing in Winter! The area divided between Trentino and Lombardy guarantees the opportunity to ski in late Autumn and in Spring, thanks to the ski lifts that allow access to the Presena glacier at 3000 meters. Passo Tonale offers 30 modern lifts that service 100 km of ski tracks, that receive abundant natural snowfalls and which boast a complete artificial snowmaking system. The jewel in the crown is the famous black ski slope, "Paradiso", one of the longest, most beautiful and thrilling downhill runs in all of Europe.

### Peio In the Stelvio National Park

The ski center in the middle of the famous Stelvio National Park. In a valley reaching right up to the summits of the famous Cevedale **Group** lies the town of Peio, in the middle of the Stelvio National Park.

Peio is the highest community in Trentino, the oldest tourist resort in Val di Sole, famous since 1650 for its **thermal springs**. This winter sport resort is especially suitable for families with **children** – for people looking for peace, and who want to enjoy the long ski slopes extending from the sides of Monte Vioz to the outskirts of the town.



# The magnificent three

There are three black ski slopes that you must try in Val di Sole. With frequent direction changes, gradient plunges and incredible views, these slopes offer three unique and unforgettable experiences. These are "cult" slopes, the best that any skier could ask for. All of these slopes have one important common factor; a deep and optimal base thanks to the artificial equipment and the optimal grooming techniques available in Val di Sole.

### The Folgarida Black Run

A severe run, with a drop in gradient of over 600 meters, ratified for several competitions, and hemmed in by the surrounding forest. A thrilling descent with the last wall illuminated at night, allowing night skiing of impeccable quality, which was used in the 1999 ISF World Snowboarding Championships as well as numerous editions of the Topolino Snowboard Cup. If you are able to get down this slope without stopping you really deserve a pat on the back.

## Orti and Marilleva

A challenging slope, carved out of the heart of the forest, it has many turns and gradient changes. The steepest part, the "Orti" slope, which is over 700 meters in length, is found at the very beginning, while the rest of the slope is sweeter which allows for many breaks if required.

Technical Details: Ski slope "Black" Start 2.100 meters asl Finish 1.450 meters asl Gradient drop 650 meters Length 2.500 meters

### Paradiso -Passo Tonale

This is one of the more historical ski slopes in the entire Alpine arc. Opened to the public in 1963, over the last 40 years many works have been carried out to ensure that the track stays up to date while keeping to its historical past. The last improvements were carried out in 2004/2005 together with the opening of the new Tonale-Paradiso lift that replaced the old but glorious lift which was gracefully retired.

Technical Details: Ski slope "Black" Start 2.585 meters asl Finish 1.851 meters asl Gradient drop 734 meters Length 3.000 meters

After a fairly simple start of 200 meters, from the Paradiso Pass, the slope gathers pace towards Tonale. The track is guite wide but with a challenging and constant gradient, which after 1500 meters steers diagonally across the face so as to limit the skiers speed, where you can catch your breath for a moment if needed. After 250 meters of relatively easy track the slope hits another vertical wall, after which you arrive at the new bridge which crosses the road and arrives at the upper parking level. From the bridge it is 300 meters to the start of the new cabin lift. A very technical slope, designed for skiers of high ability, with a constant snow cover of optimal quality due to its North facing position. It is especially recommended during the months of February. March and April.

## The Vermiglio Cross-Country Ski Center

The main cross-country skiing area is in Vermiglio, which is part of the regional SuperNordicSkipass circuit. It offers 4 different difficulty levels for a total of 25km of Nordic ski trails. The trails wander between the hamlets of Volpaia, Stavel and Velon, amongst pine forests and ancient mountain shelters.

All the trails are designed for varied technical settings, both for competitions and ski orienteering. The 1 km "Laghetti" ski trail is floodlit until 11pm in the evening.

Services in the center include, showers and changerooms, bar, parking, ice skating, ski hire and a ski school.

# From the train to the ski slopes in just 12 minutes!



# The only project of its kind in Italy!

Just 12 minutes from the center of Val di Sole directly to the heart of the skiing area Folgarida – Marilleva – Madonna di Campiglio: all thanks to the new 8 seater cabin lift from Daolasa which departs directly in front of the Daolasa – Commezzadura train station!

The lifts at Folgarida and Marilleva perfectly integrate with the Trento-Malé-Marilleva railway, therefore creating a unique "tire railway track-cable" system.

The snow in Val di Sole is now closer than ever before. From the train station in Trento, skiers can take the train of the Ferrovia "Trento-Malé-Marilleva" directly to **Daolasa-Commezzadura** where the new cabin lift awaits to whisk them up to the top of the ski carousel Folgarida-Marilleva-Madonna di Campiglio.

Now you can reach the ski slopes from the city without having to worry about traffic or parking or the problems of bad weather. In Trento the departure point for the Trento - Malé - Marilleva 900 train is in the same train station as the state rail system.

From an Eurocity directly to the local train "Trento-Malé-Marilleva" reaching the ski resorts of Val di Sole. For information on train timetables, visit the internet sites at www.valdisole.net and www.ttspa.it

This historical train line Trento-Malé began to run in 1909 in an era of social revival that pushed Trentino into the modern age. It was one of the first European train lines to use electricity. After a reconstruction in 1950, in May 2003 the extension of the rail line from Malé to Marilleva 900 was opened.

Now with the opening of the new cabin lift in Daolasa and the connecting train station, the progression of this unique rail system continues into the future, with the opportunity to reach the slopes by train.

#### THE CUISINE

Solandrian cuisine centers on simple but by no means unimaginative dishes, many of which are based on secret recipes dating back to grandmother's era. They are characterized by their Alpine origins, and make use of dairy products still carrying the aroma of hay, the fragrance of fresh grass, and the smell of pristine mountain air. Solandrian cuisine includes many game dishes. often garnished with forest berries and healthgiving herbs. You really ought to try such dishes as Strangolapreti ("Priest Chokers"), gnocchi di comede (wild mountain spinach dumplings), capellazzi or monchi (delicious pasta dishes), potato pancakes, and many different kinds of soup. And when it comes to dessert, why not try some torta di fregoloti (a kind of crumble-topping cake), carrot cake, or the all-time favorite: strudel. Traditional Solandrian cuisine is available in numerous restaurants and hotels in the valley.



#### **SHOPPING**

For those with taste for shopping, there are two excellent hubs in Val di Sole to satisfy your craving: **Cogolo di Peio**, with its pleasant and quiet

pedestrian area that is closed to traffic, has a wide variety of shops in a traditional atmosphere; **Malé**, the administrative center and main commercial point of Val di Sole. In Malé, the political, cultural and economic historical center of the valley, you can find a wide variety of shops offering clothing, sporting goods, crafts and local products, with wine bars and pastry shops scattered amongst them offering a multitude of products.

#### MALÉ POOL

Great news for lovers of swimming and wellness services: the Malé public swimming pool.

Completely rebuilt with an innovative and modern bio-architectural system, the new Malé swimming center has two main pools: a semi Olympic pool 25x12,50 meters with 6 lanes and a depth ranging from 1.2 to 1.8 meters; and a 140 msq recreation pool dedicated to learning how to swim and relaxing, with lounge beds and a hydro-massage with a constant depth of 1.25 meters. A third pool of a smaller size and depth with a small waterfall and water shower is reserved for children. The modern structure which has been built with families in mind, also boasts a nursery, services and a children's play area.

# The thermal springs in Winter Wellness in Pejo

Peio is the source of three thermal springs: the Fonte Alpina (with a low mineral content), the Fonte Antica (a high-pH spring rich in iron and bicarbonates), and the Nuova Fonte (with a medium level of carbon dioxide). The new Thermal Center has a wide assortment of therapeutic thermal-water treatments effective in dealing with the following illnesses and conditions: respiratory diseases, impairments of the locomotive system (legs and feet), rheumatic disfunctions, skin conditions, and cellulitis. The Health Center – with a fitness center, the indoor swimming pool, and the hydromassage tubs – as well as the Wellness Center – with a steam bath and an aroma bath – are accessible to all.
